2023 CIRB ANNUAL MEETING **ANTITRUST STATEMENT**

It is the intent of the Crop Insurance and Reinsurance Bureau, Inc. ("CIRB") to conduct all meetings well within the boundaries of discussion clearly permitted by Federal and State antitrust laws.

Although the business of insurance is granted some exemption from Federal law by the McCarran-Ferguson Act, the exemption is not total and exists only if state law governing the business of insurance is present in a given area of activity.

In addition, CIRB has obligations under Federal Antitrust law that must be met, primarily in avoiding the areas of price-fixing and bid-rigging. The McCarran-Ferguson Act notwithstanding, all individuals in attendance at a CIRB meeting must avoid any discussion that may involve boycotts, intimidation or coercion.

In view of the above, any discussion at any meeting by any speaker, particularly on a non-legislative subject that dwells on the above subjects, or that suggests minimum pricing, standard underwriting criteria, or a market division plan in which a group of companies would participate, unless these are specifically covered by state law, must be avoided. If such a discussion occurs, individuals should exercise their right to object, have their objection noted in the minutes, and absent themselves during that part of the meeting that they deem objectionable.

Dr. Michael Dickinson Senior Scientist RenaissanceRe Risk Sciences Dr. Dickinson is a senior scientist responsible for leading research, development, and operational support focused on risk assessment and forecasting, Dr. Dickinson joined Renaissance Re Risk Sciences' predecessor organization as a senior research scientist in 2003. Dr. Dickinson is part of a team that provides expert analysis, risk assessment and real-time forecast guidance on tropical cyclones across the globe. Dr. Dickinson is also responsible for the generation of seasonal outlooks for California wildfire and provides real-time analysis during active events. He has also contributed to the evaluation and construction of wildfire risk assessment models. for California and Australia, Dr. Dickinson has over 25 years of experience as a meteorologist
